- West Michigan Works handles the local workforce development in 7 counties. They assist job seekers as well as companies that are looking to hire employees. They have helped 42,000 job seekers and 3200 employers find employees for over 10,000 jobs.
- West Michigan Works also gathers job data to help figure out what the trends are and where the largest gaps are throughout the state.
- West Michigan Works also helps with recruitment and training. Last Year 252 employers applied and were awarded 10 million dollars to help train current employees, new employees and create apprenticeships.
- The current focus across the State is the trade fields that include manufacturing, construction and healthcare.
