Featured Topic: Engaging the New Gen Workforce

- Jaylyn McCloy of Experience Grand Rapids led a panel of GVSU hospitality students to talk about employment issues important to them including:
 - General Workforce Expectations
 - Descent wage, opportunities for advancement, positive work environment, management support.
 - Leave work at work, setting boundaries for self.
 - Engagement & Retention
 - Incentives, fair pay, making a difference at work, passion for the job, positive feedback and constructive criticism (at the time of an incident vs during annual review, so behaviors can be corrected).
 - Mentorship & Collaboration
 - Step by step guidance, one-on-one time with mentors to talk about big picture things not just the current job at hand.
 - Explain why things are done the way they are in a new way if message isn't connecting.
 - Don't stereotype based on age.
 - Communication & Leadership
 - Clear communication with employer asking questions of staff and not just directing.
 - Emerging Trends
 - Aligned values
 - Al (does that impact the heart of hospitality which is people).
 - Utilize social media (reviews) and technology.
 - Insights for Employers
 - Leave a lasting impression, creating personal experiences, being part of someone's special day, growth support, being supported at work and at home.
 - Aligning job titles with pay (which carries more weight).
 - Incentives for jobs well done or exceeded (special activities or gifts, time off, bonuses).
 - Building network and meeting with others in the industry, college events, networking and personal connections in existing job or future jobs.
 - Utilizing LinkedIn to share job and industry info (vs email).
 - Strengthening the student network (HTM Club).
